<u>Anti-Transgender Bills in the United States</u>

- **33**: Number of states voting on anti-transgender (trans) legislation in 2021.
- 117: The number of bills introduced in the current legislative session that target the transgender community, according to the Human Rights Campaign.
 - The highest number the organization has records since beginning tracking anti-LGBTQ legislation more than 15 years ago.
- **Children**: The main focus of many bills. Bills look to ban trans children from playing sports or using the restroom of the gender they identify as.
- Felony: Some bills could make it a felony for doctors to provide life-saving care to trans youth.
 - Despite medical best practice guidelines from the Endocrine Society, Child Mind Institute, and American Psychological Association recommending that states provide genderaffirming care for trans children.
 - Studies show children unable to access gender-affirming care experience higher rates of depression, anxiety, and suicide than trans youth with supportive doctors and family.
 - The most common gender-affirming treatment option for trans youth under 16 is puberty blockers. These pause puberty with little to no permanent side effects while teens decide what course of gender-affirming care they want to take.


In New Hampshire

- HB86: Medical ban that would criminalize and define gender-affirming care for trans minors as child abuse.
 - Current Status: Removed from Consent.
- HB198: Would stop trans athletes from playing school sports on the bases of preventing gender discrimination for cis women.
 - Current status: Retained in Committee.

Some Good News

On March 31, 2021, President Joe Biden issued the firstever federal proclamation of its kin for this year's International Transgender Day of Visibility.

On March 31, 2021, the Pentagon issues new policies to allow transgender Americans to service openly in the military. This reversed the Trump administration's ban.
