Welcome to KUUF's 2021-2022 Service year! I hope you are all doing well and have "weathered" this last incredible year. In addition to being generally restricted to our homes and little social interactions, we have been challenged with wearing masks and the need to get vaccinations. Wouldn't it be nice if that was all behind us, and we could turn our attentions to be more active in supporting the core UU values?

Recently we have all had the need to make choices; decisions that are not simple: wear a mask or not, get immunized or not, travel or not, etc.. To some these decisions seem simple, however, at their core, they have been the source of great differences of beliefs and disagreements about basic rights, making them difficult. Also, while attending to the need to protect ourselves and others, we have not had time to do work that calls us; volunteerism, social actions, search for truth and meaning,....

As a guide to help us make decisions and to direct our personal energy, I am listing the well know 7 UU Principles:

- 2. Justice, equity and compassion in human relations;
- Acceptance of one another and encouragement to spiritual growth in our congregations;
- 4. A free and responsible search for truth and meaning;

- 5. The right of conscience and the use of the democratic process within our congregations and in society at large;
- 6. The goal of world community with peace, liberty, and justice for all;
- 7. Respect for the interdependent web of all existence of which we are a part

Let these be our guide.

It was with concern and regret that we canceled the 2021 Summer Gathering, it was a difficult decision. Thanks to those that put time and effort into making all the arrangements!

Our first of the season in-person Sunday Service is planned for Sept. 12, 2021, 11AM at Proctor's Stone Chapel. Celebrate Bisexuality Day

September 23rd is Celebrate Bisexuality Day. Bisexuals are the largest self-identified group within the LGBTQA+ community but the amount of mental health research focusing on bisexual people is small.

Bisexuals can experience homophobia or biphobia – a dislike of or prejudice against bisexual people. They can also experience monosexism, which is the belief that people are only heterosexual or homosexual. They can be socially excluded from both communities, called bi-erasure. Bisexuals are more likely to hide their identity when compared to gay men and lesbians.

Mood/anxiety disorders are higher than lesbians and heterosexual women for bisexual women. They are also higher in bisexual men when compared to heterosexual men, but similar to gay men. People who identify as bisexual have a higher risk of suicide than heterosexual, gay, and lesbian individuals.

Support bisexual people. You've already started by reading this! Support local, national, and global charities. Validate – it is not up to you to decide if a person is or is not bi – just listen.
