



REASONS: Banned and challenged for profanity, sexual references, and use of a derogatory term



Me and Earl and the Dying Girl By Jesse Andrews

REASONS: Banned and challenged because it was considered sexually explicit and degrading to women

REASONS: Banned and challenged because it depicts child sexual abuse and was considered sexually explicit



This Book is Gav By Juno Dawson


REASONS: Banned, challenged. relocated, and restricted for providing sexual education and LGBTQIA+ content
