

# WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO YOU TO BE UU? WHAT IS YOUR PASSION AND YOUR THOUGHTS?

Do you know that whaling illegally continues, salmon fishing in Britsh Columbia is causing Orca whales to starve, Tuna is being over fished on the Aftrican coast and turtle protection patrols are being attacked by turtle poachers?

Though some of their tactics to prevent the distruction of our marine life are drastic, the Sea Shepherd Conservation Society (SSCS) continues as an international non-profit, marine wildlife conservation organization that voluntarily protect our marine wildlife.

Established in 1977, their mission is to end the destruction of habitat and slaughter of wildlife in the world's oceans in order to conserve and protect ecosystems and species. We use innovative direct-action tactics to investigate, document, and take action when necessary to expose and confront illegal activities on the high seas. By safeguarding the biodiversity of our delicately balanced ocean ecosystems, Sea Shepherd works to ensure their survival for future generations.

**AFRICA** is home to some of the world's richest tuna grounds. But more than 50% of the fisheries resources in the stretch of coast ranging from Senegal to Nigeria alone have already been overfished according to the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO).

**ICELAND** June 21st, Iceland killed their first endangered Fin whale since 2015

January 2018 – Overall the 67th Meeting of the International Whaling Commission has been a success for the whales.

Thanks to all the nations that supported the whales and a very special thank-you to Brazil for the Florianopolis Declaration. Thank you to our anti-poaching partners Costa Rica and Ecuador and especially to Gabon for their strong defense of the whales at this historic meeting.
